93.9 Protecting Public Employees who Report Wrongdoing

[Whereas,] Rationale:

Canada has not enacted laws to protect whistle blowers. As a result, employees and public servants with the Canadian government

cannot report wrongdoing or fraud without fear of jeopardizing their positions.

[RESOLVED,] The National Council of Women of Canada urges the Government of Canada to:

1. Introduce ?whistle blowing? legislation to protect public employees and all employees in government funded

enterprises who, after unsuccessfully pursuing internal channels of redress, make public information on illegal or unethical

behaviour;

2. Hold accountable to such laws both government institutions and non-governmental institutions which are government

funded, that harass whistle blowers.
