## 94.5 Review of the Role and Function of Social Programs

Whereas, The federal government has instituted limits to the funding of social programs; and, Whereas, Many provincial cuts have been made through technical changes without an informed discussion of policy

alternatives; and,

Whereas, Social programs were developed to ensure the health, welfare and education of individuals; and.

Whereas, Alleged savings to the federal government are an illusion, these costs having been passed on to the provinces

and municipalities; and,

Whereas, Continued cutbacks may require more expensive remedies at a later date; and,

Whereas, The gap between the rich and poor in Canada is greater than in any G-7 country except the United States of

America; and,

Whereas, The United Nations Economic and Social Council 1993 Report on Canada's performance as signatory under

Article 10-15 of the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights indicates serious concerns

about Canada's poor record in reducing the impact of poverty; therefore be it,

RESOLVED, That The National Council of Women of Canada commends the federal government for undertaking a review of

social programs, and urges the government to:

- 1. Halt the erosion of social programs;
- 2. Review the function and role of social programs with the provincial governments; and,
- 3. Continue with widespread consultation about new social program alternatives which will strengthen the

Canadian social fabric and ensure the health and education of all citizens into the twenty-first century.
