2) A resettlement effort for some 15,000 Afghan refugees who've been forced to leave Afghanistan and are living in other countries. This initiative will be rolled out over the next year. This is not an evacuation and the application process has not started yet. When it does, applications will be processed through the United Nations High Commission for Refugees and other partners.
